#### Unità di misura Promoting risk-taking culture & knowledge-intensive products:

- Capacity building & Know-how transfer through workshops & programmes
- Call for projects promoting cooperative research by SME (in cooperation with the Ministry of University and Research, Italy)
- Cooperation in business plan competitions:
  - the **Newcom** international Business Plan Competition
  - the Start Cup, a regional business plan contest

#### SME/entrepreneurs coaching:

- Basic support: focus on specific aspects (feasibility studies, market & technology assessments, business planning, business model evaluation, networking & clustering, partnership in applied R&D projects -prototyping, engineering and testing,...)
- Advanced support: proactive support based strong synergies between several ToW departments, partners of the District and other local stakeholders, aiming to a constant cooperation with the company



### Management of intellectual assets



### Support and guidance to researchers and SME:

- Assistance through the whole value chain of IPR:
  - Early stage consulting about R&D positioning
  - support to R&D experts in defining R&D results
  - investigation and assessment of the state of the art
  - practical assistance in patenting & copyright registration
  - economic support in meeting copyright costs (in exchange of royalties),
  - brokerage and licensing of patents in order to reach new markets and new R&D opportunities (spin-off, start-up but also larger firms)
- Results:
  - 50 patents filed to date
  - MoU with the Polytechnic of Milan to evaluate actions for IPR support
  - MI.TO tech a hub for the intellectual property management of the national public institutions
  - Training of human resources from other High-TechDistricts partners of A.Di.Te

### Networking & Clustering



Based on an interactive evaluation of on companies' requirements, the Networking Department main activies are:

- 1. Torino Wireless Network:
  - it brings together companies in Torino Wireless District area
  - it promotes opportunities for cooperation among companies and to increase interaction between them and companies from other Italian and foreign districts
  - it provides researchers, entrepreneurs, venture capitalists, potential customers and suppliers with access to up-to-date fact files about member companies

#### 2. Clustering actions

Clustering specifically facilitates structured relations among SMEs so to create networked enterprises in specific industrial sectors such infomobility, agriculture and food logistics, and e-health (exploring)

Objectives:

- analyze the sector's industry and markets so to identify specific business opportunities
- facilitate companies aggregation for collaborative projects and related products, whit higher level of complexity

**Cluster Infomobility :** 

**32 companies** participating in working groups

4 vertical projects with commercial focus, each one involving 8-15 firms

2 structural action to strengthen the cluster own structure (Città-Vetrina and Organismo di indirizzo)

Promotion of technology sourcing from large firms to high-tech based SMEs to develop mutually beneficial business

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### Catalysing capitals and professional investors

#### Unità di misura

Supply side: catalysing capitals and investors By leveraging the initial funding, TW actively pursued the creation of Angel and Seed Capital entities and is currently an investor partner in the creation of a business angel (Piemontech) and a seed fund (Innogest Capital)

#### Investment attitude

Investment funds are managed in a completely private attitude, and according to international market standards:

- ROI is a crucial objective
- Only by providing investors with good financial returns, more capital can be attracted in the area to invest in innovation.

### Role of Torino Wireless

Demand side:

- addressing entrepreneurs' "inadequacies" so to help companies to overcome the "Valley of Death" :
  - Blending of managerial & financial approaches in mixed teams of professional that perform a simultaneous coaching of firms being accelerated
  - Proactive support and revision of SME's growth strategy towards internationalisation.
- cooperation in investment contests (Eg. European Venture Contest, opening session Sept 2006, Pitching Session October 2007)

#### <u>Outcomes</u>

- Sustainable and supportive business ecosystem: innovative growth-oriented firms at their early stages are provided with well established access to capital schemes.
- Bring clever money in the local area and set off a virtuous circle of capitalinnovation-capital in the local area
